

Parent Checklist for Child Care Programs COVID-19 Guidelines

Updated October 8, 2021

What are the Hygiene, Cleaning & Disinfecting Policies & Procedures?

- Practice appropriate hand hygiene by handwashing with soap, running warm water, and disposable paper towels; alcohol-based hand sanitizer containing 60% or more alcohol for areas where handwashing is not available/practical, for children over 2 years old.
- Staff and children must wash hands:
 - Upon arrival
 - when they are dirty,
 - Between all program activities
 - After using the restroom or diapering assisting children with toileting,
 - When returning to the classroom/program from outside or another space
 - Before & after eating
 - Staff before and after food handling or eating, after handling pets or other animals.
 - After contact with any bodily secretion or fluid,
 - > Staff before and after the administration of medications
 - Before departing
- Throughout the day, clean/disinfect frequently touched surfaces (e.g. door handles, light switches, children's chairs, multi-seat strollers, playground railings and hand holds.
- Tables and high chairs are cleaned and sanitized before and after children eat at them.
 Food preparation areas are cleaned and sanitized before and after snacks and lunch is prepared.
- o Regularly clean/disinfect equipment, toys, and materials using appropriate products
- Limit children from using toys that cannot be cleaned/sanitized (e.g. dress-up clothes, puppets, and stuffed animals).

<u>Does the Program Conduct Daily Health Checks/Screening for Children, Families, Employees</u> <u>and Visitors?</u> Programs have always needed to do a daily health check. Now it is ramped up and they should be asking about people in the household.

- Daily health checks (e.g. questionnaire, temperature check)
- Screen by asking about child and household members: Since 6/28/21 this is optional
 - COVID-19 symptoms in the past 14 days
 - positive COVID cases in the past 14 days
 - close or nearby contact with confirmed or suspected COVID-19 case in past 14 days
 - Any recent travel



What is the Program's Exclusion Criteria?

Child or staff member should not attend or should be sent home with symptoms including:

- Fever 100.4° or higher
- > Cough
- Sore throat
- Muscle or body aches
- > Headache
- > Fatigue

- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- > Chills or repeated shaking with chills
- New loss of taste or smell
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea
- Responses based upon questionnaire

How are Children & Staff Monitored for Symptoms of Illness?

- Staff & children must be monitored throughout the day for any symptoms of illness
- o A sick child or staff should be immediately sent home
- Immediately notify the local health department about any positive COVID-19 test result by an employee or child
- A plan should be shared with parents on what the program would do if they learn/or are informed that an unvaccinated staff member or child has COVID-19; this could include closing the classroom or program for 10 days.

How Does the Program Handle Physical Distancing?

There is no current guidance but here are some suggestions and previous practices that were part of the initial guidance.

- Stagger arrival and pick-up times
- When feasible, limit parents from entering the programs by staff welcoming the child at the door or bring the child out to the parent/guardian at the end of the day. However, as per regulations a program must have an open-door policy and allow parents access to the program. This should only happen after parent has been screened.
- o Centers Do staff and children stay together throughout the day.
- Centers Ensure that different stable groups of children do not utilize common spaces at the same time as another group
- Caring for and supervising young children requires staff to be near and interacting with children. Unvaccinated staff should distance at least 6 ft. at all times, unless caring for a child requires being closer.

What Type of Protective Equipment Does the Program Use?

- Face Coverings All people age 2 and older who are able to medically tolerate a face covering, regardless of vaccination status, must wear a mask indoors. This includes parents during drop off and pick up times.
- Staff must be trained on how to put on, take off, clean, and discard masks & gloves.



Program COVID-19 Vaccination Policy -

It is not mandated by the state for child care providers to be vaccinated from COVID; however, a child care program can have their own policy and requirements.

- Does the program have and will it share its policy on staff being required to be vaccinated for the COVID-19 vaccine?
- What percentage of staff/caregivers in the program have received the COVID vaccine and/or are full vaccinated?
